

100% of EMS Users of the Vie Scope find it easy to use.

During the EMS World Expo, over 600 Paramedics intubated with the Vie Scope on difficult Airway manikins in the simulation lab. 214 Paramedics took the time to give demographic information and answer a three-question survey. The demographic information recorded included their name, department, age, sex, level of education, and intubation experience.

The three questions asked about the Vie Scope” were:

1. Was the Vie Scope easy to use?
2. Was the Vie Scope easy to Learn?
3. Would you recommend the Vie Scope?



The process and results were as follows:

- Paramedics were given the opportunity to try the Vie Scope on a Difficult Airway Manikin.
- Minimal training with the Vie Scope was provided, they were shown the roadmap to Intubation landmark mnemonic TEN – Tongue, Epiglottis, Notch - they were shown the vocal cords with the Vie Scope.
- First intubation attempts were with a Mac blade to identify how difficult the manikin was, then they intubated using the Vie Scope.
- Upon completion of successful intubation with the Vie Scope, the 3 question survey was completed.

Results:

Was the Vie Scope easy to use?

214 of 214 answered yes. 100%

Was the Vie Scope easy to Learn?

213 of 214 answered yes 99.5%

Would you recommend to your EMS Service?

209 (98%) answered Yes , (2) (1%) Maybe ,(2) (1%) No
